The NATA Secondary School Athletic Trainers' Committee (SSATC) conducted a survey among ATs in the secondary school setting to determine job satisfaction. The results can be found in the white paper: Secondary School Athletic Trainers: A Data-Centric Overview of Job Satisfaction and Strategies for Risk Reduction, Recruitment and Retention.

The purpose of this white paper was to indicate to Athletic directors and school administrator's things that can be done or utilized in order to retain athletic trainers at the secondary school level. We are highly recommending that our members in this setting read and share this report with their school administrators. The committee created this report as a tool to open the dialogue with school administrators and create a positive and healthy working environment for secondary school ATCs.



The ICSM will address issues affecting the student-athlete and athletic trainers at the collegiate level. The ICSM will identify relevant, timely issues in the field of athletic training and collaborate with various organizing bodies of collegiate and intercollegiate athletics to improve student athlete safety, well-being and healthcare by influencing policy and providing resources.

Council Roster

This athletic conference-based committee is comprised of members from the college/university setting, including ATs working in DI, DII, DIII, Junior College and NAIA institutions. Currently, representatives and associates of the ICSM are interviewing all candidates who submitted their applications for our open ICSM positions by the November due date.
